

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# Now That You Are A Christian

Now that you have you been obedient to God (Matthew 7:21-23), you have begun a new life in Christ. Let's review some important factors in your obedience:

- 1. You believe Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God (1 Corinthians 15:3-4);
- 2. You have repented of your sins (Acts 2:38)—turned your back on your former way of life;
- 3. You confessed your faith before in Christ (Romans 10:9-10);
- 4. You were baptized into Christ (Galatians 3:26). You have now been raised to walk in a newness of life (Romans 6:4) and are a citizen of the heavenly kingdom (Philippians 3:20).

Okay...what now?

The life of a Christian is one of service (2 Corinthian 5:9-10; 1 Corinthians 10:31-33). It is a life of seeking heavenly things (Colossians 3:1-4), a life of growing (2 Peter 1:5-10).
